Keeping Colostrum Clean

1. Put colostrum into clean containers with clean lids or nipples.

Start with clean containers and lids/nipples.

Sanitize bottles and nipples just before use with warm water & milk line sanitizer (chlorine bleach) solution.

2. Put colostrum containers to be stored into an ice bath immediately after dumping from collection pail (or add ice bottles to pail).

Bacteria start multiplying soon after harvesting.

Bacteria double in numbers every 20 minutes at cow body temperature.

Our goal is to chill colostrum to be stored to 60° within 30 minutes after collecting.

If an ice bath is not practical, try freezing ice in plastic bottles and add them to the collection pail at the ratio of 1 part ice bottles to 4 parts of colostrum.
