

Summer is over. How Come My Cows are Not Peaking the Way They Should?

- Heat stress is history. It's now fall and chilly. My cows are not peaking as high as I think they should be. What is going on?
- Compared to cows that had cooling during their summer dry period, cows that were heat stressed during their dry period can lose between 8.8 to 16.5 pounds per day production.
- The consequences of heat stress during the dry period can extend out 20 to 30 weeks into the next lactation.
