We wanted to notify you that our lab now has the capacity to run the bioPRYN blood pregnancy tests on **goats and sheep** as well as our current testing on cattle.


For those of you that don't know, we are an affiliate laboratory for bioTracking, LLC. You can visit their website at <a href="https://www.biotracking.com">www.biotracking.com</a>.

The BioPRYN test measures the level of placental Pregnancy-Specific Protein B (PSPB) in serum. PSPB is produced by the placenta and enters the animal's blood when a fetus is present. The BioPRYN assay can be reliably applied to detect pregnancy status in does and ewes 30 days post breeding by AI or from when the buck or ram was removed from the pen.

To submit blood samples, please mail or drop off to us either a red top or purple top blood tube with 2cc or more of blood. The sample does not require refrigeration.

We set up our samples on Tuesday / Thursday and the results are done the next day — Wednesday / Friday. If you have questions, visit our website at <a href="www.atticacows.com">www.atticacows.com</a> for helpful tips on how to draw blood and submission forms.

New Years - All samples will only be plated Tuesday / reported Wednesday. Samples will need to be here by 2pm that day to be plated.



## Salmonella Dublin

The cattle-adapted strain Salmonella Dublin has made its way into northeastern dairy herds. Recently the Cornell Diagnostic lab has been receiving an increased number of infected samples and it is causing a stir in the cattle health community. Like other strains some Salmonella, this Dublin strain is **zoonotic** or able to cause severe illness in humans as well as cattle. Additionally, this bug has been found to be multi-drug resistant adding to the heightened alert of farmers, veterinarians, and public health workers alike. Dublin is unique in that it often shows up as a respiratory pathogen with or without the presence of diarrhea in calves. Warning signs in calves include coughing, and labored fever, breathing, and has the potential to spread quickly through the calf barn. If you have concerns about Salmonella Dublin or other calfhood diseases talk your to veterinarian.
